SECTION 1. FRUIT AND VEGETABLES.

Bob Duly Cup

1. Five onions 250g (9oz) and under.
2. Three onions over 250g (9oz).
3. Six shallots.
4. Five potatoes, one variety, 170-250g (6-9 oz) each.
5. Your largest potato.
6. Five carrots, tops reduced to 75mm (approx. 3").
7. Four stalks of a leafy vegetable (e.g. kale, chard, spinach).
8. Three leeks with roots.
9. Three heads of garlic.
10. Six runner beans with stalks.
11. A runner bean race of three beans placed end to end - any condition. Longest wins.
12. Six French beans, including pencil, podding and climbing varieties.
13. Your longest marrow, any condition.
14. Two courgettes, not more than 203mm (8").
15. Two sweetcorn, partially opened to see rows.
16. Three globe beetroots, tops reduced to 75mm (3").
17. One cucumber, any kind.
18. One lettuce, any variety, with root.
19. Six tomatoes with stalks.
20. A truss of tomatoes, at least three ripe.

21. Six cherry tomatoes with stalks.
22. Two peppers, any colour, sweet or chilli, with stalks.
23. Four dessert apples, complete with stalk (not to be polished).
24. Four cooking apples, complete with stalk (not to be polished).
25. Four of any fruit, other than apples, complete with stalk.
26. A vase of herbs, own vase (not flowering).
27. A collection of four single vegetables (four varieties) exhibited in a seed tray. Must be on list of vegetables (see page 8).
28. One ugly or misshapen vegetable or fruit.
29. Any other vegetable not mentioned in classes 1-22, quantity not specified.
30. Any other fruit not mentioned in classes 23-24, quantity not specified.

34. Three stems of fuchsias, any variety.
35. A vase of three rose stems, one bud, one bloom, one blown (same variety).
36. Three stems of cluster-flowered floribunda roses, any variety(ies).
37. A vase of three single stem roses, any variety(ies)
38. Three stems of gladioli, any variety(ies).
39. My favourite garden flower, one stem.
40. Three hydrangea heads.
41. The largest sunflower head, no stem.
42. A vase of four different kinds of ornamental foliage, one stem of each.
43. Three heuchera leaves, in a vase provided.
44. Flowers from my garden, own container.
45. Six fuchsia florets on a board provided.

46. Three gladioli florets on a board provided.
47. Six petunia florets on a board provided.
48. A flowering pot plant, maximum pot size 255mm (10") diameter.
49. A hanging basket.
50. A 203mm (8") pot of home-made compost.

51. One bloom, giant or large, over 220mm.
52. Three stems, medium or large, between 170mm and 220mm, one or more varieties.
53. Three stems, small or medium, under 170mm, one or more varieties.
54. Display of mixed dahlias, not more than nine stems.

55. Three blooms, any variety/ies.

56. 'Tiny Jewels' mini floral arrangement not to exceed 200mm all around (2019).*
57. Floral arrangement in a 400g tin – baked bean size (1999).*
58. 'Harvest Time' arrangement, maximum width 762mm (30").*
59. Floral arrangement depicting a book title, any height with accessories (1971).*

SECTION 6. COOKERY AND HANDICRAFT

60. Homemade tomato salsa (2007).
61. A jar of soft fruit jam, sealed (1978).
62. A Cricket Tea – 2 different sandwiches and 2 different cakes (2007).
63. A 'Can't Go Wrong' chocolate cake (1999). See recipe on page 23.
64. Apple tart (2004).
65. A home-made liqueur.

- 66. A painting or drawing in any medium, that has not been previously exhibited.
- 67. A handmade object in any medium, that has not been previous exhibited.
